FROM THE VICAR

You may know that we have had a new Bishop installed at St Asaph earlier this year - Bishop Gregory. Indeed, he will be coming to Llanwddyn on Sunday, October 25th to confirm various people from the Deanery of Llanfyllin

Before he came to us, Bishop Gregory worked at the Anglican Communion Office. You may well be asking what the Anglican Communion is.

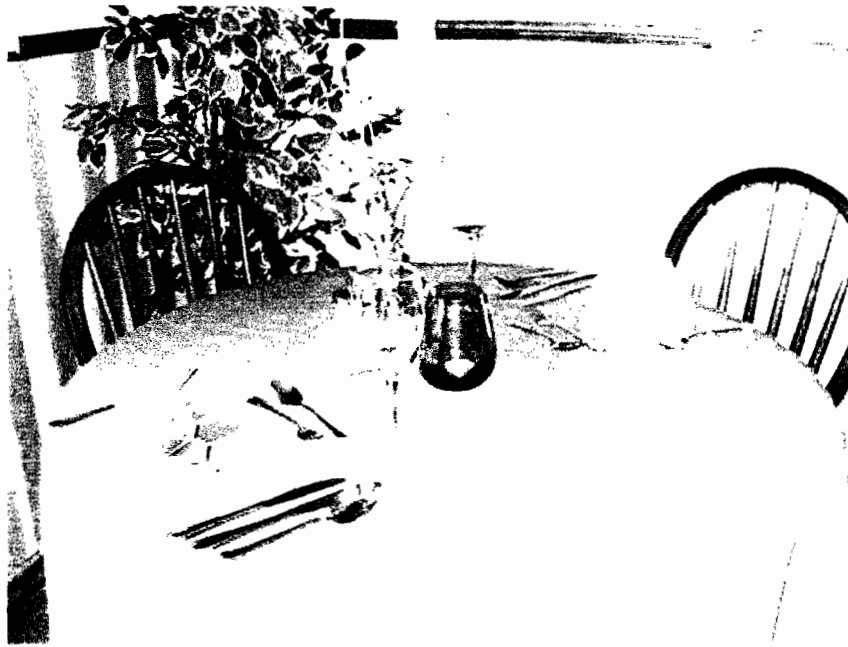
If asked what church they belong to, the answer often comes back 'C. of E.' - short for Church of England. Some people still seem to think that in Wales "church" means Church of England but in fact for the last ninety years - since 1920 - the Church in Wales has been an independent part of the world-wide Anglican Communion.

This is like other parts of the Anglican Church of which there are said to be 26 million Anglicans in England, 20 million in Nigeria, 21 million elsewhere in Africa, 5 million in Australasia and 3 million in North America. There are 70,000 in Wales. In the southern hemisphere, faith is strongly traditional and is growing but here in the west it is increasingly in decline and becoming more liberal and diverse. There are about 70 million Anglicans worldwide. Those of us who belong to the church can perhaps take courage from being a part of such a large, world-wide and diverse body. There's far more to it than the 'C of E' and we are certainly very far from being disciples on our own!

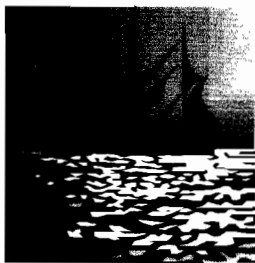

Cyngor Cymuned Llanwddyn Community Council
Adroddiad/Report

A meeting of the Llanwddyn Community Council was held on Monday 27th July 2009 at the Community Centre chaired by Cllr. Frances Ellis. The Community Council had received correspondence from various bodies including the Scottish Power Renewables regarding two Drop days consultative meetings at Llwydiarth Village Hall on 31st July 2009 and At Lake Vyrnwy Hotel on 1st of August 2009. These two meetings were open meetings for any member of the community to attend and gain information on the proposed Dyfnant Forest Windfarm. Other correspondence included correspondence from Powys Standards Committee on responsibilities of elected members: the Annual report of the Ombudsman for Wales; communications from Un Llais Cymru/One Voice Wales on local meeting in Meifod and information on various training programmes; a letter from DEFRA on review of public authorities in England and Wales on actions relating to Biodiversity issues: communication from BBC on assistance during the switchover help scheme. The Community Council was informed that planning permission was granted on 14/7/09 for the Lake Vyrnwy Holiday Home Park application to site one Holiday Lodge and one static Caravan and associated works with existing caravan site. The Community Council have also temporarily closed the Top Village playground on the grounds of safety issues. Attention was also made to the overgrown hedge surrounding the top village playground. The War Memorial and the memorial obelisk in memory of those who lost their lives during the construction of the Dam have been cleaned up and the surrounded ground been cut. Another option that has been discussed regarding the provision of the Bus Shelter is to construct a lean-to shelter to the existing Toilet building providing a canopy as a shelter. The Football club Stand is utilised as a temporary bus shelter for pupils waiting for the School Bus. The Annual Accounts of the Community Council was approved and prepared for the District Auditor. It was also agreed on the site for the Doug Morris memorial seat to be sited by the Telephone Kiosk and in front of No 2 Abertridwr. It was also agreed to improve the path to the Telephone Kiosk and the Letter Posting box. Recycling matters were also discussed. There was no further to report on progress of the future of the redundant School building. The next meeting of the Community Council will be held on 28th of September in the Community Centre at 7.00 pm
