FUEL

We would ask you to note that due to the continuing high cost of fuel we have had to reduce the maximum allowed limit to £20 per visit. This will enable us to keep costs competitive and fuel in stock.

FLETCHER

We are delighted to announce that we have been able to pass on your donations to Shrewsbury Hospital Maternity Unit. In memory of our son Fletcher, we have made a donation of £605 which they are putting towards 2 reclining chairs in their family rooms to make "relative stays" more comfortable than their present camp beds. Once again we thank everybody for their support and generosity.

EGGS & BOXES

Retail Laws on egg selling have now changed in that we are only able to sell Free Range Eggs stamped and boxed at the issuing farm. We would like to thank Maldwyn for his support over the years in supplying locally produced Eggs for our customers. Our suppliers have also informed us that due to costs involved they are no longer recycling egg boxes and as a result we will no longer be collecting old egg boxes.

DVD CHANGES

We have changed the terms of our DVD rentals with our suppliers. As a result we now stock over 150 DVDs with 4 new guaranteed releases per month. We are also able to send back and change 20 titles per month hopefully giving us a completely fresh look on a monthly basis. Unfortunately the previous setup was operating at a loss each week. This new format is on trial for 6 months at which point we will have to decide if we are keeping DVDs in store.

£20 NOTES

Did you know that the Bank of England is withdrawing the older style £20 note? From the 30th June the old style "Elgar" £20 note will no longer be supported at retail level. Most banks, building societies and Post Offices will accept them for deposit to customer accounts for several months after this.

These coffee mornings are going to be a two monthly fundraiser for much needed cash for the hall.

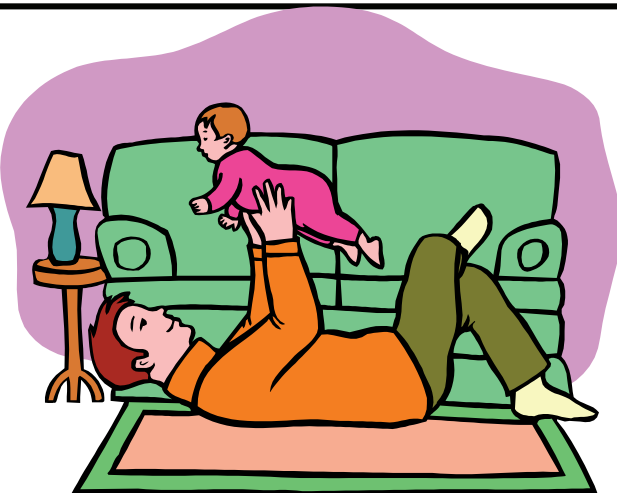
