FROM THE VICAR

As the time approaches when we have a fair number of visitors to the area, may I firstly draw attention to the new Llanfyllin Deanery Trail that has been set up to help guide visitors. This trail includes St Wddyn's as well as the churches at Llanrhaeadr YM and Pennant Melangell and also Capel Sardis. A guide is available on a laminated card in each church, as well as leaflets explaining the whole trail.

We have in our area a glorious heritage which reflects the Christian beliefs and practices of generations of our people who have lived here. Sadly, adherence to the Christian faith has declined and an article in one of the national newspapers this week reported an increase from 31% of people in 1983 to 43% in 2008 of people who classify themselves as 'non-religious'.

In point of fact the word 'religion' simply means the living of life by a rule, so in fact everyone lives with values that are important to them even if these are only the support of family and friends. But these ideas of religion is a long way from commitment to Jesus Christ and the opening of one's life to the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Perhaps the approach of holiday time, which for some people at least may indicate some relaxation of pressure, is a period when we can consider these matters afresh. In the Gospels, Jesus constantly invites us to consider our priorities in life and also He invites us to follow him on the road that leads to what he calls 'the more abundant life'. Let us pray that it may be so.

**OVER £3,000 RAISED FOR CHARITY AT BODFACH HALL GARDEN
OPEN ON 31ST MAY 2010**

The Garden Open at Bodfach Hall on 31st May was the most popular yet with over 600 people attending, up 30% on last year. The increase in numbers was helped by the Garden Open being organised this year in partnership with the National Gardens Scheme and their famous "Yellow Book" and by the attendance of Glyn Davies MP.

The weather was mercifully dry and the Garden Open raised £3,082 for local and national charities. The event itself made a profit of £2,045 from entry money and teas. In addition, there were stalls for local charities which raised a total of £1,037 for their individual organisations - Llanfyllin Workhouse, Hope House, the Llanfyllin branch of the NSPCC, St Cynog's Church in Llangynog, the North Powys National Gardens Scheme and the North Montgomeryshire Volunteer Bureau.

The rhododendrons were at the peak of their flowering. The North Powys Youth Orchestra played throughout the afternoon and delighted everyone with their enthusiasm and high standard of playing. A donation of £150 was made to the Orchestra to thank them for playing.

In addition to the local charity stalls, Rosie's plant stall and the Bodfach Bookfair did very brisk trade. The exhibition of Geoff Wilkinson's photographs and the delicious homemade teas also proved extremely popular.

Simon and Maggie Baynes said:

"We were very pleased with the success of the Garden Open. Over 600 people attended and we would particularly like to thank Phil Robinson, Clare Ellis and Wendy Bell and all the team at Bodfach for the help provided to make the afternoon so enjoyable. Glyn Davies MP made a very good speech and chatted with dozens of people throughout the afternoon.

The profit is being split between the National Gardens Scheme (75%) and two local charities (25%): St Cynog's Church, Llangynog for roof repairs and the Llanfyllin Workhouse.

We would like to thank all those who attended and supported the Garden Open for making it such a success".
